4. OBJECTIVES, SYLLABUS CONTENT AND INTENDED TEACHING OUTCOMES

4.1. Course objectives (including form of classes)

The aim of classes is familiarisation of students with basic problems related with human sexology, including the biological essentials of sexuality, determinants of normal development, as well as psychological aspects of interpersonal attractiveness.
